Dear Mr. Cook:

On December 6, 2012, the Oregon Health Authority (OHA), Drinking Water Services Program, issued a civil penalty against you in the amount of \$3,500 for various violations of the rules governing water systems. The primary issue with your water system is that it has levels of arsenic and nitrate that exceed the maximum contaminant levels and you have not installed a treatment system to ensure that the customers of your system receive safe drinking water.

We understand you have been negotiating with the City of Ontario in hopes of getting financing to hook up to city water but those negotiations have fallen through.

If you cannot find a way to supply water to your customers that meets safe drinking water standards OHA will have little choice but to file an action in the circuit court and seek an order requiring the installation of treatment or ask the court to require the sale of the water system under a special master.

OHA sincerely hopes that you find a way to come into compliance with its safe drinking water rules.
