RE: NOTIFICATION OF EXTENSION TO THE ADMINISRATIVE ORDER ISSUED TO LAZY ACRES MOBILE HOME PARK, PWS OR4101399, ON FEBRUARY 19, 2008.

Lazy Acres Mobile Home Park is a public water system that is subject to regulation under Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 448.115 to 448.290 and Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) 333–061–0005 to 333–061–0098.

The Oregon Department of Human Services, Public Health Division, Office of Environmental Public Health, Drinking Water Program (Agency) has received a request from Lazy Acres Mobile Home Park for an extension to the final deadline specified in the Notice of Violation and Administrative Order (Order) and subsequent extension.

Agency personnel have reviewed the progress made by Lazy Acres Mobile Home Park in the installation and operation of its water treatment system, and discussed the risks posed by allowing an additional two months to comply with the deadline specified in the previous extension. Based upon the progress made by Lazy Acres Mobile Home Park and continued public notice provided by the system, the Agency hereby grants Lazy Acres Mobile Home Park an extension until March 30, 2009 to complete Compliance Action No. 1 as specified in the Order. The granted extension is not a modification of the Order, which remains in full force and effect.

This extension does not constitute a waiver, suspension or modification of the requirements of the Oregon Drinking Water Quality Act: ORS 448.115 to 448.285; and administrative rules OAR 333-061-0050 to 333-061-0295, which remain in full force and effect.

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This extension does not relieve Lazy Acres Mobile Home Park of any responsibilities or liabilities established pursuant to any applicable federal, state, or local law or regulation. Issuance of this extension is not an election by the Agency to forgo any civil actions authorized under the Oregon Drinking Water Quality Act.

Failure to comply with all requirements in the Order or this extension, by the specified due dates, may result in additional enforcement action, including the assessment of civil penalties in the amount of \$50 per day per violation (OAR 333-061-0090).
