The purpose of this ordinance, in conjunction with the Uniform Plumbing Code Chapter 10, State of Oregon cross connection regulations and the current edition of the Cross Connection Control Manual - Accepted Procedure and Practice, published by the Pacific Northwest Section, American Water Works Association, is to protect the health of the water consumer and the potability of the water in the distribution system. Inspection and regulation of all actual-or potential cross connections between potable and non-potable systems is required in order to minimize the danger of contamination or pollution of the public potable water supply. Controlling and preventing cross connections is accomplished by either removing the cross connection or installing an approved backflow prevention assembly to protect the public potable water supply.

The Ashland Acres Mobile Estate is required to eliminate or control all cross connections throughout its service area. Therefore, anyone wanting or using water from the Ashland Acres Mobile Estate is required to comply with these regulations. The owner of the property in which a cross connection occurs is fully responsible for all damaged incurred.

The owner or manager will enforce the provisions of this ordinance. The owner may delegate responsibilities to a Certified Cross Connection Control Specialist/Inspector. The provisions of this ordinance may supersede state regulations but in no case shall they be less stringent. All approved standards shall be approved by the Ashland Acres Mobile Estate and the owner or manager. All backflow prevention assemblies required by this ordinance shall be a model approved by the Oregon Health Division DWP.

Approved backflow prevention assemblies required by this ordinance shall be installed under the direction of the owner or manager, and/or under the supervision of the Cross Connection Specialist/Inspector per Ashland Acres Mobile Estate's standards.

All RPBA's, RPDAs, DCVAs, DCDAs, and PVBA's are required to be tested at least annually and all air gaps installed in lieu of an approved backflow prevention assembly shall be inspected at least annually. Completed test reports shall be returned to Ashland Acres Mobile Estate within 30 days after receipt of the yearly test notification. Tests and inspections may be required on a more frequent basis at the discretion of the owner.

Authorized employees of Ashland Acres Mobile Estate with proper identification shall have free access at reasonable hours of the day to all parts of a premises or within buildings to which water is supplied. Water service shall be refused or terminated to any premises for failure to allow necessary inspections.

Failure of the customer to cooperate in the installation, maintenance, repair, inspection or testing of backflow prevention assemblies required by this ordinance shall be grounds for termination of water service to the premises or the requirement for an air gap separation.

NOTICE TO ALL TENANTS

February 2, 1996

The Oregon State Department of Human Resources, Health Division requires back flow devices on all cross connection to the drinking water supply.


Enclosed is a written ordinance that I am required to deliver to all Tenants.

A cross connection would be where a feed line or hose is taken from the drinking water supply and used for irrigation or other purposes where possible contamination could enter the pipe or hose. If cross connections are present they must be fitted with a backflow preventative device to stop any contamination from entering the drinking water supply/source or be removed.

As it is against the rules and regulations of Ashland Acres Mobile estates for any tenant to use the well water for any purpose other than for consumption or personal hygiene, I would require that any cross connection to be removed. Installing a back flow device would not imply permission to use the well water for other purposes.
